This Memorandum of Understanding outlines a programme of cooperation between NUST and the GLAU.

WHEREAS NUST and the GLAU recognize the value of educational cooperation and exchanges for the purposes of deepening the understanding of scientific, technological, historical, social, economic and political issues, as well as the traditions of each of the respective cultures; and

WHEREAS NUST and the Institution affirm the desirability of strengthening the bonds between the two academic communities through joint academic activities.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

AREAS OF COOPERATION

In order to promote international co-operation and understanding and to foster institutional development, the **Parties** agree to co-operate in the areas of curriculum development, faculty, staff and students exchange, research and materials exchange.

Participation in conferences, seminars and academic meetings

1. CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

NUST and the **GLAU** agree to develop and upgrade curricula and qualifications with the objective of offering quality programmes and qualifications subject to the approval by the respective Senates. The initial focus of the activities at **NUST** will be on building institutional capacity in the faculty of Computing and Informatics.

2. FACULTY / STAFF EXCHANGE

- 2.1 In order to promote professional development at their respective institutions, the Institutions agree to establish an exchange program for faculty and professional staff. The Host Institution agrees to provide hospitality in the form of office space, library privileges, access to technology and resources and other local privileges customarily afforded to faculty in residence.
- 2.2 The **Host Institution** will also assist in the finding of suitable accommodation and assist with compliance with immigration regulations of the host country. Faculty exchanges will be mutually agreed upon between the Institutions and will be based on a work plan covering the full period of the exchange. The visiting scholar will prepare a final report upon completion of the exchange period.

3. STUDENT EXCHANGE

3.1 The **Parties** will develop and conduct a student exchange program offering coursework, internships, joint projects, and research which are directed at the preparation of highly qualified and internationally competent graduates in Computer Science and Informatics.

- 3.2 Participants will be registered students, selected by their respective institutions to participate in the program on the terms as agreed between the institutions. Students will pay tuition fee only at the **Home Institution** and no tuition fee will be payable at the **Host Institution**. Students will however, be expected to pay the applicable registration fee and other relevant costs at the **Host Institution**.
- 3.3 English will serve as the language of instruction at both Institutions during exchange periods.

4. RESEARCH AND MATERIALS EXCHANGE

NUST and the **GLAU** will encourage to participate in Faculty Development Programmes (FDPs), conferences, seminars and academic meetings and promote collaborative research activities between the faculties, staff and students of the two Institutions to promote the generation of knowledge and development of the institutions and their respective societies.

5. FORMAL FACULTY AND STUDENT DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

To further develop human capacity building in Computer Science, Informatics, and Electronics and Communication Engineering at **NUST**, the **GLAU** will offer nominated faculty and student's opportunities to obtain formal qualifications at Masters and Doctorate levels within its Master's and PhD Programmes. The specific terms and conditions will be agreed upon in an addendum that will from part of this Memorandum of Understanding. Admission of these Programmes is subject to admission regulations of the Institution.

6. FUNDING

The **Parties** agree to investigate opportunities to raise funds to support the different activities contained herein. **NUST** and **GLAU** agree to facilitate activities with business and industry in their respective countries when appropriate.

7. PROGRAMME COORDINATORS

As specific and mutual areas of interests are identified and agreed upon, each Institution will appoint a programme coordinator to ensure the implementation of the various planned activities.

8. IMPLEMENTING AGREEMENTS

Supplemental agreements will be entered into to establish details for the operation and implementation of specific programmes and will become attachments to this Memorandum of Understanding.

DURATION OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement will be effective upon signature by duly authorised representatives and will remain in force five (5) years or until either of the **Parties** decide to terminate it in accordance with the provisions of Clause 11.
