



**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING  
BETWEEN  
UNIVERSITY OF PERADENIYA, SRI LANKA  
AND  
GLA UNIVERSITY, MATHURA, INDIA**



This memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is made and entered into on the dates and places mentioned below by and between:

UNIVERSITY OF PERADENIYA a university duly established under the Universities Act. No. 16 of 1978 in Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka (herein after referred as UoP which term shall mean and include the said UNIVERSITY OF PERADENIYA), the ADDRESS BEING University of Peradeniya, Peradeniya, Sri Lanka.

And

The GLA University, India established under U.P. State Legislative Act of 2009 (UP Act 21 of 2010). The university is recognized by UGC under act 2(f) and ranked among the top Universities of Uttar Pradesh and India and has been accredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with 'A+' Grade and recognized by University Grants Commission (UGC) under section 12B of UGC Act of 1956, having its campus at NH-2, Mathura-Delhi Road P.O. Chaumuhan, Mathura, Uttar Pradesh 281406, India. (Hereinafter referred to as & "GLAU").

**Whereas** University of Peradeniya is represented by Vice-Chancellor, UoP and Acting Registrar, UoP Whereas GLA University is represented by Registrar and Dean International Relations & Academic Collaborations.

Whereas the University of Peradeniya and GLA University are collectively referred to as parties.

On behalf of the UoP, the parties agree to establish relations in order to carry out the activities through the Department of Computer Engineering, Faculty of Engineering of UoP and sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) within the fields that are mutually acceptable and in accordance with the rules and regulations governing each institution.

1. The parties agree to implement following activities:
  - (a) Exchange of faculty members and research scholars.

- (b) Participate in joint research and training activities and meetings for education and research.
- (c) Exchange of materials in education and research, academic publications and academic information.
- (d) Encourage visits/exchange of faculty members or students from one institution to the other for the purpose of engaging in research and other educational activities as agreed upon by both parties.
- (e) The parties will acknowledge the partnership initiated by this MoU in the official website and agree to update the backlink information of the website of the partner University.

2. The parties agree to the following conditions;

- (a) Activities listed above shall be implemented upon the mutual agreement by both parties.
- (b) If necessary, arises separate agreements shall be entered into in respect of each activity before the implementation of any particular activities listed above.
- (c) The terms of this MoU at no stage should be treated as creating any legal entitlement/obligation between the parties. It constitutes a mutual understanding which aims of developing academic exchange and cooperation between the two parties.
- (d) All financial arrangements will have to be negotiated, at any stage, and will depend on the availability of funds and shall be spelt out in separate agreements.
- (e) Exchange of materials in education and research, academic publication and academic information has to be done in accordance with the prevailing University rules and regulations of the parties and within the legal framework of both countries.
- (f) The two parties agree that in the event the research collaboration leading to patent rights, will be worked out on a case-to-case basis through separate agreements, in accordance with the policies of the two parties on intellectual property.
- (g) Any controversy or claim arising under or relating to the terms of this MoU or at any alleged breach thereof should be settled amicably by two parties.
- (h) Maintaining the necessary level of communication and flow of information as to allow for the proper development and follow-up of the activities indicated in this MoU
- (i) Either party may request changes to this MoU. Any change shall be mutually agreed upon by both parties and shall be incorporated into it and shall come into effect when signed by both parties to this MoU.

- (j) This MoU will be effective for five years from the date it is signed. It shall be renewed for successive five-year period upon entering into a new MOU based on the terms and conditions mutually agreed upon.
- (k) This MoU may be terminated at any time by mutual consent or by six months' notice in writing by either party. Such termination should be made without prejudice to the already commenced activities under this agreement and/or separate collaborative agreements entered under this MoU.
- (l) Each Party shall not reveal to any third party any information acquired by it further to this Memorandum or any other ancillary agreement or transactions contemplated herein without the prior consent of the other Party. This provision does not apply where any disclosure is made at the request of a supervising or controlling authority or by court order.
- (m) The parties reserves the right for reasons of national security, national interest or public order to suspend temporarily, either in whole or in part, the implementation of this MoU, which suspension will take effect immediately after notification given to the other parties through diplomatic channels.
- (n) No parties shall be liable for any delay in performing, or for failure to perform, its obligations under this MOU, nor be liable to any claim for compensation or damage, nor be deemed to be in breach of this MOU to the extent that such delay, failure or breach arises from any cause, event or circumstances beyond the reasonable control of that party (including acts of God, fire, flood, earthquake, natural catastrophe, storm, epidemic, war, terrorism, explosion, riot, civil disturbance or other national emergency, embargo, strike, lock-out or industrial dispute (involving employees other than its own), any acts or restrains of government or public authority, judicial orders or any breach or non-performance of this MOU by any other party provided the same arises without the fault or negligence of such party.
- (o) This MoU represents the entire and integrated understanding between the parties and supersedes all the prior negotiations, representations, and agreements, whether written or oral.
